The last meeting of the Wirral South Deanery was in May and the next one will be in October. In June this year a Deanery Eucharist was held at St Barnabas Church Bromborough, conducted by Bishop Peter.

In his sermon the Bishop spoke of the importance of welcoming people into Church, especially newcomers who are not used to attending a service. They often don't know quite where to sit, which book to use etc. Bishop Peter gave as an analogy a situation where he might wish to place a bet on a horse. He would feel a little awkward going through the door, would not know how to go about it and would be glad of a friendly assistant coming forward to help. The Church Door can also be intimidating!

The service was followed by an excellent buffet supper in the Church Hall.
