Bible Reading Mark 1: 1 – 11

Reflection from John The Baptism of Jesus

- The car wouldn't start and you were late for the interview.
- The taxi didn't come and you were late for the start of the film
- The Message never got through and your friend didn't come to take you to the party.

What happens before a main event can be really significant and today the main event is the Baptism of Jesus.....but we need first to notice John the Baptist.

The Gospel begins with John to show that while God is doing something exciting and new....it is the fulfilment of an older story.

- John is the signpost the human link piece between Old and New Testament.
- The voice of the Prophet had been silent in Israel for 300 years but now as promised God's messenger had come.
- John was a man of burning convictions and uncompromising message calling people back to God.

If you go to the Rotary Club or Probus I wonder If you'd invite him to become a member?

If John was a Minister....how welcome would his ministry be among us?

YET Jesus described John IN THESE TERMS:

For I say unto you, Among those that are born of women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist: but he that is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he. (Luke 7:28)

John was a giant of a man...his role deeply significant - yet we have been given so much more revelation than he had by Jesus...how much more special are we in Kingdom terms.

- HE was a signpost to Jesus...... How are we a signpost to him today?
- HE was bold in his witness......How bold are we?
- HE stood for truth in places of authority...when did you do that as a member of the Kingdom of God?

John the Baptist was sent from God, and he urged the Jewish community to be baptized with repentance for their sins, and his impact on the life of the nation during the six months of his ministry was shattering. And then Jesus himself comes on the scene. Jesus leaves his home his ordinary home in Nazareth and comes to the desert. He comes from Aunty Mary's house to see his cousin John.

Jesus is utterly indistinguishable from all the rest. He was fully and gloriously human. The lad from up the road.

YET He has come there that he might be baptized by John.

Here he was....The Lord, The Lamb of God......the Anointed One who would send the Holy Spirit on all who followed him.

That Jesus, utterly Human and gloriously divine....came to John for Baptism. Why?

1. JESUS WAS BAPTIZED TO INAUGURATE PUBLICLY HIS MINISTRY.

The Lord Jesus didn't drift into his ministry. There was a start, a public induction performed by John, confirmed by God speaking from heaven and the coming of the Holy Spirit. This signified the arrival of Christ on the world stage.

Baptism was the beginning to Jesus' ministry which John declared to all.

"Look, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (Jn. 1:29). That is what he had come to do.

Jesus' Jordan baptism inaugurated him into a ministry whose climax would be not in a pool but on a cross.

JESUS WAS BAPTIZED SO THAT HIS UNIQUE RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD BE MADE KNOWN.

It was not that at this moment Mary's boy was adopted by God as his Son, but that at his baptism, the eternal Sonship of Jesus our Lord was made known.

John the Baptist who was alongside Jesus when he had baptized him. "John gave this testimony: 'I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will baptize with the Holy Spirit." I have seen and I testify that this is the Son of God." (John 1:32-34).

Now Jesus' true nature was made known to a wider audience and as he was revealed the door was opened to you and me too that we might know the Saviour for ourselves and share his love with others. **Amen**

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen
